Dear Ms. Sammons:

A re-inspection of your retail store, Rite Aid # 11400, located at 1910 Falls Valley Road, Raleigh, NC 27515, was conducted on June 4, 2008 by Food Regulatory Specialist Janna Spruill of this Department. This re-inspection revealed the continued presence of objectionable and insanitary food storage conditions. We specifically direct to your attention the following observations and FDC 0014161-0014162:

1. Approximately twenty seven (27) packages of candy products were observed with Indian Meal Moths larvae casings and webbing contamination on the exterior surfaces of the product packaging. Products effected included Riesen, Jolly Ranchers, Tootsie Rolls, Blow Pop, Dum Dum Pops, and Sour Patch Kids.

The above referenced items with an estimated value of sixty five dollars (\$65.00) were placed under State Embargo FDC 0018406 and were voluntarily removed from sale and disposed of by management during inspection.

- 2. More than forty (40+) moth casings and webbing were observed on the shelving inside the plastic shelf spacers/compartments and inside the peg holes of the pegboard walls of retail aisles 2,3, and 19 as well as the endcaps between aisles 2 and 3.
- 3. More than seventy (70) moth casings and webbing were observed on approximately twenty seven (27) packages of candy products.

Our records indicate that similar conditions were documented during previous inspections of February 18, 2008 and March 19, 2008. These inspections were conducted in response to a consumer complaint of insects in candy products.

We have directed this matter to your attention as the President/CEO of Rite Aid in order that you take immediate steps to address these issues and make the necessary corrections. Your written response outlining the actions you are taking to correct the above referenced conditions will be anticipated by this office within fifteen (15) days of receiving this letter.
