



Susan G. Komen for the Cure® is the nation's largest private source of funding for breast cancer research and community outreach programs. Locally, the NC Triangle Affiliate of Susan G. Komen for the Cure® granted \$1 million to 18 organizations in 2011-2012. These grants are funded with a portion of the proceeds generated by the Komen NC Triangle Race for the Cure®, individual and corporate philanthropy, and fundraising events throughout the year.

2011 – 2012 Grantees

Caring Community Foundation Inc, "Pay It Forward" works with social workers and oncologist in service area to identify patients struggling with financial challenges while undergoing cancer treatment. They provide financial assistance to uninsured and under-insured women undergoing breast cancer treatment in counties the affiliate serves.

Caswell Family Medical Center, "Mobile Screening Mammography Services for Caswell County" program will increase access to and awareness of screening mammography for under/uninsured residents of Caswell County and the surrounding service area.

Community Health Coalition, "Sisterhood Project Phase IV" addresses breast health needs in Durham County through education, screening, transportation, mobile mammography, appointments during non-traditional hours, and emotional support. This program is also piloting a Co-Survivor and support initiative.

Duke University "Bridging the Gap: A partnership for Breast Cancer Screening" program provides free clinic services and breast MRIs for high risk women in 10 counties.

El Centro Hispano, "La Damas de Rosa / The Pink Ladies" using Lay Health Advisors in the Latino community to promote breast self awareness, this program serves the low-income, under/uninsured Hispanic women in Durham County.

El Pueblo, "Comunidad Sana" program provides one-on-one and group educational sessions through the use of Spanish language media. They also provide patient navigation for screening, diagnostic, treatment, and support services for recent immigrants, low-income, and uninsured and underinsured Latinas in 16 counties.

Johnston County Health Department, "Breast Screening, Education, and Cancer Assistance Program" provides screening, education, and outreach through the health department to under/uninsured minority women in the community.

Lincoln Community Health Center, "Mammograms for Low-Income Uninsured Women" provides outreach, mammography and diagnostic mammography services to registered Lincoln patients. The program also provides client and provider reminders, education, and a diverse survivorship program for Durham County.

2011 – 2012 Grantees Cont.

Nash County Health Department, “Mammograms for Life!” provides culturally appropriate outreach through community and faith based partnerships. They also provide mammograms and diagnostic follow-up services for uninsured and underinsured women in Nash County.

Piedmont Health Services Inc, “Project Access-Chatham” a breast cancer screening initiative that provides breast cancer education, clinical breast exams, mammography, and patient navigation for underserved women in Chatham County. The program also provides follow-up and referral services to patients in need as well as culturally appropriate outreach to the Latina community.

Piedmont Health Services Inc, “Project Access –Orange and Caswell” a breast cancer screening initiative that provides culturally appropriate breast cancer education, clinical breast exams, mammography, and patient navigation for underserved women in Caswell and Orange County. The program also provides follow-up and referral services to patients in need as well as in-kind outreach services to the migrant seasonal population.

Rex Healthcare Foundation, “Rex Mammography Certificate Program” provides breast cancer screening and follow-up to under/uninsured and low-income women in Wake and surrounding counties using a mobile mammography unit.

Rex Healthcare Foundation, “Rex Surgical Biopsy Certificate Program” helps under/uninsured and low-income women in Wake County and surrounding counties who require surgical consultation and surgical services related to breast care.

UNC Chapel Hill, “Genetic Testing” partners with the UNC Hospital system to provide genetic testing for women in Durham, Orange, Wake, Chatham, and Edgecombe Counties.

UNC Chapel Hill, “Get Real and HEEL- An Aftercare Breast Cancer Program to Improve Quality of Life” a 5 month program that provides prescriptive exercise and physical therapy to women who have completed chemotherapy, radiation, or surgery within 6 months. They also provide workshops to educate and motivate survivors to improve their physical and psychosocial well-being.

Wake County Human Services, “Educate our Women (EOW)” provides screening, outreach/diagnostics services for under/uninsured women in Wake County. They also facilitate a Latina Breast Cancer Support group and provide culturally appropriate materials to the Latina population in Wake County.

Warren County Free Clinic Inc, “Warren/Vance Komen Initiative” provides breast health education and information to under/uninsured and low-income women 40 and older in Vance and Warren counties. They also provide clinical screening, mammograms, treatment, and follow-up services for these women.

YWCA, “ENCOREplus®”, partnering with Rex Mobile Mammography unit and Raleigh Radiology this program provides breast health education and screening, transportation, and faith-based outreach, to women in Franklin, Johnston and Wake counties.
