**U.S.A. vs. April Michelle Krob**

**Petition for Action on Supervised Release**

COMES NOW Donald E. Hargrove, probation officer of the court, presenting a petition for modification of the Judgment and Commitment Order of April Michelle Krob, who, upon an earlier plea of guilty to Possession With Intent to Distribute 24 Grams of a Mixture or Substance Containing a Detectable Amount of Methamphetamine, was sentenced by the Honorable James C. Fox, Senior United States District Judge, on October 21, 2004, to the custody of the Bureau of Prisons for a term of 20 months. It was further ordered that upon release from imprisonment the defendant be placed on supervised release for 60 months under the standard conditions adopted by the court and the following additional conditions:

1. The defendant shall participate as directed in a program approved by the probation office for the treatment of narcotic addiction, drug dependency, or alcohol dependency which will include urinalysis testing or other drug detection measures and may require residence or participation in a residential treatment facility.
2. The defendant shall participate in a program of mental health treatment, as directed by the probation office.
3. The defendant shall consent to a warrantless search by a United States Probation Officer or, at the request of the probation officer, any other law enforcement officer, of the defendant's person and premises, including any vehicle, to determine compliance with the conditions of this judgment.

April Michelle Krob was released from custody on May 24, 2005, at which time the term of supervised release commenced.

**RESPECTFULLY PRESENTING PETITION FOR ACTION OF COURT FOR CAUSE AS FOLLOWS:**

On or about December 20, 2007, Krob relocated her residence from 317 Stoney Hill Road, Goldsboro, North Carolina, to a residence located at 1719 U.S. Highway 70 West, Goldsboro, North Carolina, without the prior approval of her supervising officer. Furthermore, on January 16, 2008, the defendant submitted to a random urine screen that yielded a positive test result for methamphetamine. Krob subsequently admitted her use to her supervising officer. The defendant signed a Waiver of Hearing agreeing to the proposed modification of supervision.


**PRAYING THAT THE COURT WILL ORDER** that supervised release be modified as follows:


1. While under supervision in the Eastern District of North Carolina, the defendant shall participate in the DROPS Program and, in response to detected illegal drug use, shall be confined in the custody of the Bureau of Prisons for a period not to exceed 30 days of intermittent confinement, as arranged by the probation office, in the following increments: First Use - Two Days; Second Use - Five Days; Third Use - Ten Days. The defendant shall begin the DROPS Program in the second use level.
2. The defendant shall be confined in the custody of the Bureau of Prisons for a period of two consecutive days as arranged by the probation officer and shall abide by the rules and regulations of the designated facility.

Except as herein modified, the judgment shall remain in full force and effect.


