I deeply regret that actions I have taken have reflected poorly on the NC Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. I was not asked by anyone at the Department to contact a colleague, fellow veterinarian, and personal friend of mine for over thirty years, Dr. Eric Gonder. Nobody at the Department was aware of the actions I took and I never discussed my call with any Department employee. As a veterinarian, I have dedicated my career to protecting the health of the poultry flocks of this state and any implication to the contrary is without merit.

My rationale for contacting Dr. Eric Gonder was to immediately curtail avian abuse. Further, Dr. Gonder, as the staff veterinarian for Butterball, was directly responsible for insuring animal cruelty, avian abuse, was not occurring at the poultry farms. I knew that, as a fellow professional veterinarian, Dr. Gonder would want to quickly be made aware of any alleged abuse.

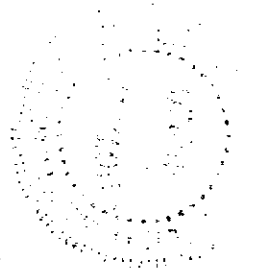
