- (3) **if you (and co-counsel if any) are splitting your time (including rebuttal), please describe the division of time.**

Your early attention to these items will be appreciated. Additionally, if yours is not a pauper case, all printing fees and any required bonds must be settled prior to argument.

One-half hour is the maximum time allowed per side for argument, and must be divided by agreement among multiple attorneys or parties on a side. If there is more than one party sharing your 30 minutes, please notify the Clerk prior to argument as to how you would like to divide your time.

Finally, appropriate dress and behavior is expected by the Court of both the attorney and his or her guests. No food or drink is allowed in the Courtroom.
