In North Carolina: Before final debate: 46% to 46%. After debate: 47% to 47%. Today: 48% to 48%.

After 2nd Presidential Debate, With Coney Barrett Now A Justice And Hunter in the Headlines, NC's 15 Electoral Votes Remain Up for Grabs; Last-Minute Reddish Drift Among Men & High-School Educated Voters May Give Trump Tailwind, But Biden's Early Votes Are In The Bank:

Donald J. Trump will carry North Carolina's prized 15 Electoral Votes, or he won't, when votes are counted next week, but that's all one can say with certainty, 6 months after it was clear that Joseph R. Biden would be the Democratic Party's choice to oppose him, according to SurveyUSA final 2020 pre-election tracking poll, conducted exclusively for WRAL-TV in Raleigh.

At this hour, with 43% of voters telling SurveyUSA that that they have already filled out their ballot, the contest stands:

- * Trump, 48%.
- * Biden, 48%.

2 weeks ago, with Trump hospitalized and the President's surly 1st debate fresh in voters' minds, SurveyUSA had Biden at 50%, Trump at 45%. Since then, there has been just enough turbulence for Biden and his family, a more composed 2nd debate by the President and just enough forward motion on Trump's 3rd Supreme Court justice (interviews for the survey were conducted while Amy Coney Barrett was being interviewed on live television by the US Senate Judiciary Committee), that certain groups may have inched their way back into Trump's corner.

Among NC men, Trump [returns to where he was](#) 6 weeks ago in SurveyUSA polling, up by double-digits. Trump must carry male Tarheels to offset Biden's certain advantage [among women](#), where Biden's double-digit advantage has been consistent across 3 tracking polls. Among voters with a [high-school education](#), who had dabbled with Biden in 2 previous polls, Trump closes with material momentum. The contest is effectively even among voters younger than age 50. The contest is effectively even among voters age 50 plus.

Among voters who have already marked a ballot, Biden leads by 17 points, 57% to 40%. No matter what happens between now and Election Day, these votes are in the bank. To be determined is how many of those who tell SurveyUSA they certain to vote but who have not yet done so, show up. Among this group, Trump leads by 13 points, 55% to 42%. A much smaller group, which has not yet voted and is not 100% sure it will, backs Trump by 17 points, 53% to 36%. Trump will need every one of those almost certain voters if he is to carry the state.

On which candidate is better able to respond to the Coronavirus, Trump and Biden end up where they started 6 weeks ago: even. 47% say Biden would corral COVID, 46% say Trump. Voters continue to see Trump as a better shepherd of the economy; this [has been stable](#) across all 3 tracking polls. Voters do-si-do on which candidate can referee the competing demands of law and order and social justice. 6 weeks ago, Trump was narrowly seen as stronger on public safety. 2 weeks ago, Biden narrowly had the edge. Today, the candidates [are even](#): 47% Trump, 47% Biden.

SurveyUSA asked voters who watched the 2nd Biden-Trump debate who they favored before that debate.

- * Trump, 46%.
- * Biden, 46%.

SurveyUSA asked all registered voters who they thought won the debate: a draw. SurveyUSA then asked those who watched the debate who they supported after the debate:

- * Trump, 47%.
- * Biden, 47%.

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Statement of Methodology: SurveyUSA is an independent, non-partisan, apolitical research company that conducts opinion surveys for media, academic institutions, commercial clients, non-profits, governments, agencies, and elected officials. SurveyUSA opinion research is conducted using a methodology optimized for each particular project. In some cases, this means data is collected 100% by telephone; in some cases, 100% online; and in other cases, a blend of the two. For those projects that are conducted “mixed-mode” (or “multi-mode”): Respondents who have a home (landline) telephone are interviewed by phone, sometimes using live interviewers, other times using the recorded voice of a professional announcer. The youngest male is requested on approximately 30% of calls to home phones, the youngest adult is requested on approximately 70% of calls. This method of intra-household selection reduces the potential for age and gender imbalance in the unweighted sample. Re-attempts are made to busy signals, no-answers, and answering machines. Landline telephone sample is purchased from Aristotle of Washington DC. Respondents who do not use a home telephone are interviewed on an electronic device, which means, for some projects, that call-center employees hand-dial cell phones and interview respondents verbally on the respondent’s cell phone, and means, for other projects, that SurveyUSA displays the questions visually on the respondent’s phone, tablet, or other device. Sample for respondents who do not use a home telephone is purchased from Aristotle or from one of several other research companies that provide access to cell respondents. Where meaningful, SurveyUSA indicates the percentage of respondents who use a home phone and the percentage who do not, and crosstabs by this distinction. Responses are minimally weighted to U.S. Census or voter file targets for gender, age and race. Target (cell) weighting is used. On questionnaires that ask about political party identification, SurveyUSA may or may not weight to Party ID, depending on client preference. Where necessary, questions and answer choices are rotated to prevent order bias, recency, and latency effects. On some studies, certain populations are over-sampled, so that the number of unweighted respondents exceeds the number of weighted respondents. Each individual SurveyUSA release contains the date(s) on which interviews are conducted and a release date. If interviewing for a particular study is conducted in Spanish, or in any other foreign language, it will be noted on the specific release. If no notation appears, interviews are conducted in English. Where respondents are filtered, such as adults, filtered to registered voters, in turn filtered to likely voters, SurveyUSA describes the filtering on the specific release. On pre-election polls in geographies with early voting, SurveyUSA differentiates between respondents who have already voted and those who are likely to vote but have not yet done so. On research completed prior to 12/31/16, SurveyUSA assigned to each question within the instrument a theoretical margin of sampling error. Effective 01/01/17, SurveyUSA assigns to each question within the instrument a credibility interval, which better reflects the sampling uncertainties associated with gathering some percentage of respondent answers using non-probability sample. Though commonly cited in the presentation of research results, “sampling error” is only one of many types of error that may influence the outcome of an opinion research study. More practical concerns include the way in which questions are worded and ordered, the inability to contact some, the refusal of others to be interviewed, and the difficulty of translating each questionnaire into all possible languages and dialects. Non-sampling errors cannot be quantified. This statement conforms to the principles of disclosure as recommended by the National Council on Public Polls (NCPP).
